# WATER QUALITY – President Dave Dailey

- The weed treatment has been successful.
   Unfortunately, the strong winds have blown the dead weeds into the North end of the Bay, from the boat ramp down, keeping them from washing out of the Bay.
- Weed Harvesters VP Ray Seigfred contacted Dave Fantuzzo, Town Supervisor concerning our frustrations about when and if the weed harvesters will come to help with this problem.
   D.F. helped to get one harvester here Monday.
   7/14 and a second was to be scheduled to come later in the week. A Harvester has been on the Bay and done some clearing of the weeds at the North end of the Bay but the operator says their permit does not allow them to do more than has been done. There are some concerned residents looking into what more can be done about the weed situation.
- Tom Boehly attended a meeting about the District10 water project. There is really nothing concrete yet and the initial focus will be south of East Bay. The extra taxes are not supposed to start until after the project has reached.

- Ray shared that he and Dave Dailey will be attending a meeting about DEC's project, Interactive Water Shed Action Plan, concerning Sterling, Wolcott and Mudge Creeks. The two later run into East Bay.
- The work done moving stone on the East side of the bar was paid for by the County at the request of the town. They hired Brian Damico who does the channel digs for us to do the work. The money came from a \$20,000 grant.
- Material has been placed on the West side of the jetty where it had eroded.


